Role description:

This role is responsible for gathering the views of college of Business and Law (CBL) students and representing them to the university. They act as the primary spokesperson for all students in their college, at every level with the university, Students' Union and wider community to ensure that everyone is represented and has the opportunity to shape their university experience. The CBL Officer will also contribute to the development of a student community in their college through representation, campaigns and events.

Part-Time Officers work 10 hours per week in their role. This will mostly be through representing students in the college, campaigning on specific issues, running activities or events and talking to students to gather feedback. It is a unique and valuable experience that requires commitment and drive. Beyond a few core meetings you must attend, you get to decide how to focus your time as an Officer representing students and completing your manifesto.

An ideal candidate will be a self-starter, driven and passionate about creating change for students and representing the views of students in their college. This includes building relationships and managing stakeholders to be as effective as possible. This role is only open to students studying courses in CBL and you must be a CBL student for at least 6 months of the Term of Office to be eligible.
